pakistanis yoginder sikand discovers a country that only remotely resembles the stereotype of the hostile muslim neighbour all too common in the indian imagination from shiela the daughter of a feudal landlord named after her mother s indian best friend to the owner of a rundown local eatery who refused to take any money as sikand was the first indian to visit his stall the author s encounters with pakistanis from all walks of life in lahore multan hyderabad sind moenjo daro bhit bhah islamabad among other places reveal a country that is unexpected paradoxical and rich in diverse narratives departing from the fiercely polemical rhetoric common in indian and pakistani accounts of each other yoginder sikand not only goes beyond the strategist s view of the india pakistan divide but dispels the myths about pakistan as the terrible other that have filtered into the indian psyche this brilliantly perceptive and quirky travelogue illuminates the pakistani side of the story while telling sikand s own tale of exploration and self discovery

since the early 1950s east asia china taiwan and south korea and south east asia indonesia malaysia thailand and vietnam have despite war and other challenges managed to transform the lives of their people whereas south asia india pakistan bangladesh and sri lanka has lagged behind the success of east and south east asia has not been accidental it has been driven by action to reduce rural poverty by the provision of decent education and health services to the people and by high quality physical and institutional infrastructure such as roads ports and railways and targeted support from the state to develop particular industries in contrast pakistan has never confronted the problem of rural poverty nor invested in public services this failure is a reflection of the power of the landed class and its urban allies this has now taken the form of widespread rent seeking in the economy with the country s ruling elite sharing out the spoils amongst themselves rather than taking measures to grow the size of the economy so that all might share in the resulting prosperity rentier capitalism sheds light on the reasons behind pakistan s failure to bring prosperity to its people when compared to other east asian and south east asian countries

a memoir of karachi through the eyes of its women an indies introduce debut authors selection for a brief moment on december 27 2007 life came to a standstill in pakistan benazir bhutto the country s former prime minister and the first woman ever to lead a muslim country had been assassinated at a political rally just outside islamabad back in karachi bhutto s birthplace and pakistan s other great metropolis rafia zakaria s family was suffering through a crisis of its own her uncle sohail the man who had brought shame upon the family was near death in that moment these twin catastrophes one political and public the other secret and intensely personal briefly converged zakaria uses that moment to begin her intimate exploration of the country of her birth her muslim indian family immigrated to pakistan from bombay in 1962 escaping the precarious state in which the muslim population in india found itself following the partition for them pakistan represented enormous promise and for some time zakaria s family prospered and the city prospered but in the 1980s pakistan s military dictators began an islamization campaign designed to legitimate their rule a campaign that particularly affected women s freedom and safety the political became personal when her aunt amina s husband sohail did the unthinkable and took a second wife a humiliating and painful betrayal of kin and custom that shook the foundation of zakaria s family but was permitted under the country s new laws the young rafia grows up in the shadow of amina s shame and fury while the world outside her home turns ever more chaotic and violent as the opportunities available to post partition immigrants are dramatically curtailed and terrorism sows its seeds in karachi telling the parallel stories of amina s

polygamous marriage and pakistan s hopes and betrayals the upstairs wife is an intimate exploration of the disjunction between exalted dreams and complicated realities
