In 1995, economist Rachel Kranton wrote a letter insisting that his most recent paper was wrong. Identity, she argued, was the missing element that would help to explain why people facing the same economic circumstances would make different choices. This was the beginning of a fourteen-year collaboration and of *Identity Economics*. The authors explain how our conception of who we are and who we want to be may shape our economic lives more than any other factor, affecting how hard we work and how we learn, spend and save. *Identity Economics* is a new way to understand people's decisions at work, at school and at home.
